We will also perform a compliance audit of federal funds and state funds in accordance with the Federal Uniform Guidance and New Jersey OMB Circular 15-08.

As part of our report, we will include recommendations and comments concerning the internal controls and financial activities of the Hillside School District Board of Education, which will be discussed with the Board of Education or its designated representatives prior to the submission of the final ACFR Report to the Board.

We would also be available to attend meetings and conferences required by the Board and officials related to the audit, as well as telephone consultation in matters relating to the audit and budget process.

- 1. The transportation contractor shall transport students to and from school related activities as set forth in the bid specifications.
- 2. If the transportation contractor fully performs the services required by the specifications and this contract, the local board shall pay the contractor for the actual transportation provided.
- 3. The transportation contractor shall transport students not to exceed in number the capacity of the vehicle designated by the local board as set forth in the bid specifications; and comply with all applicable New Jersey statutes, regulations and procedures and with the rules of the local board governing student transportation.

- 4. The transportation contractor shall ensure that the driver of each vehicle shall be a reliable person of a good character who shall possess all State school bus driver qualifications and licenses and shall comply with all statutes, regulations and procedures of the State of New Jersey and the rules and specifications of the local board. If, in the judgment of the local board, any driver of a vehicle operated under contract to transport students shall be deemed unsuitable to drive a school vehicle because of lack of driving skills, inability to control students, failure to comply with all applicable rules and regulations, incapacity, unbecoming conduct, or other good cause; the local board may request that transportation contractor to replace said driver. If the transportation contractor shall fail to comply with the aforesaid request, the local board may require the transportation contractor to show cause why such failure to comply with the request shall be deemed to constitute a breach of contract and may set aside and annul this contract.
- 5. The transportation contractor shall only transport student(s) and adults designated by the board of education and the specifications. Vehicle(s) shall arrive and/or depart the assigned locations no earlier or later as so indicated.
- 6. The transportation contractor agrees to furnish automobile liability insurance covering the operation of every vehicle transporting pupils and drivers thereof in the amount specified in the bid specifications but not less than \$1,000,000 combined single limit coverage per occurrence. The aforesaid insurance shall cover the local board as an additional named insured. The insurance company is to be one admitted under the insurance laws of this State to write the line of insurance to be provided. The transportation contractor further agrees to file the policy or certificate of such insurance with the secretary of the local board. In lieu of the aforesaid policy or certificate of insurance, self-insuring transportation contractors shall file with the secretary of the local board the certificate prescribed in N.J.S.A. 48:4-12 and 13. The local board must be given 30 days notice if the insurance is to be cancelled for any reason.
- 7. The transportation contractor will defend and indemnify the local board and any given agent, officer, or employee thereof and save harmless from and against any and all claims, actions, damages, liability and expense in connection with the loss of life, personal injury and/or damage to property arising from or out of actions of the transportation contractor occasioned wholly or in part by any act or omission to act of the transportation contractor, its agent, its subcontractor, or its employees in the performance of this contract.

- 8. The transportation contractor shall provide a suitable surety bond as prescribed in the bid specifications. If the transportation contractor fails to perform the services agreed upon herein, the local board may utilize such bonding to purchase equivalent services from an alternate provider.
- 9. The failure of one party to this contract to comply with the provisions hereof shall constitute good cause for its termination by the other party to it.
- 10. It is understood and agreed by the parties hereto that this agreement shall be without force or effect until it shall have been approved by the County Superintendent of Schools.

During the performance of this contract, the contractor agrees as follows:

The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex. The contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided by the Public Agency Compliance Officer setting forth provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.

PURCHASE CONTRACT - TERMS AND CONDITIONS

BOXX agrees to sell to Purchaser, and Purchaser agrees to purchase from BOXX the equipment, together with any carry-on options and ancillary equipment, and all other contents and furnishings (collectively, "Equipment") and provide transportation services, installation services, or other services, if any, (collectively, the "Services"), to Purchaser at the Site, in accordance with the agreed to Scope of Work attached hereto and incorporated herein, and the attached General Terms and Conditions of Proposal and Purchase Contract ("Terms and Conditions").

- 1. Used Equipment, Only to the extent that the Proposal includes the purchase of used Equipment, the following shall apply:
- a. Purchaser specifically acknowledges and agrees that BOXX is selling, and Purchaser is purchasing the Equipment on as "as-is, where-is" basis, except as expressly set forth in this Contract.
- b. Purchaser is not relying on any representations or warranties of any kind whatsoever, express or implied, from BOXX, its agents, or brokers as to any matters concerning the Equipment, including without limitation: (i) the quality, nature, adequacy and physical condition of the property, including, but not limited to the structural elements, foundation, roof, appurtenances, access, electrical, mechanical, HVAC, plumbing, sewage, and utility systems, facilities and appliances, (ii) the existence, quality, nature, adequacy and physical condition of utilities serving the property, (iii) the development potential of the Equipment, and the Equipment's use, habitability, merchantability, or fitness, suitability, value or adequacy of the Equipment for any particular purpose, (iv) the zoning or other legal status of the Equipment or any other public or private restrictions on use of the Equipment, (v) the compliance of the Equipment or its operation with any applicable codes, laws, regulations, statutes, ordinances, covenants, conditions and restrictions of any governmental or quasi-governmental entity or of any other person or entity, (vi) the quality of any labor and materials used in any improvements on the Equipment, (vii) the condition of title to the Equipment, and (viii) the economics of any past or future operations of the Equipment.

- 4. Taxes. Unless otherwise specifically set forth in this Proposal and Contract, it is specifically agreed and understood between the parties that the price herein does not include any state or local taxes or any other government charges such as impact and tap fees. Any tax or other government charge upon the production, sale, use or shipment of the products sold, now imposed or hereinafter becoming effective shall be paid and remitted to the appropriate government agency by the Purchaser, or if any state or federal law does not permit payment and remission in such manner, said tax or other government charge shall be added to the Price and shall be paid by Purchaser to BOXX. Should a permit not be issued at the time that the Equipment is ready for shipment to the Site, then Purchaser shall make progress payments to BOXX as if the Equipment had been delivered, less delivery charges specified in the Proposal.
- 6. Force Majeure. BOXX will not be in default of the performance of any of its obligations under this Contract if it is prevented from doing so due to an event beyond its reasonable control, including but not limited to acts of God, acts of war, terrorism, strikes, lockouts, civil disturbances, explosions, fires, floods, transportation disruptions, epidemics, pandemics, and weather conditions, but only to the extent and for the time period that performance of such obligation is so prevented. BOXX will not be in default of the performance of any of its obligations under this Contract if it is prevented from doing so due to an event beyond its reasonable control, including but not limited to acts of God, acts of war, terrorism, strikes, lockouts, civil disturbances, explosions, fires, floods, transportation disruptions, epidemics, pandemics, and weather conditions, but only to the extent and for the time period that performance of such obligation is so prevented. It is further understood and agreed that Purchaser will not hold BOXX responsible for liquidated damages or other damages which may be imposed upon Purchaser pursuant to any other contract Purchaser may have entered into with respect to which BOXX is not a party.
- 7. Purchaser Responsibilities. The Purchaser shall:
- a. Be SOLELY RESPONSIBLE for any and all additional materials, labor, Site Preparation, utility connections and all other items on the project, other than those materials as specifically set forth herein as being BOXX's responsibility.
- b. Ensure BOXX has free and clear access to the Site, ensure the Site is level and has adequate drainage.
- c. Be solely responsible for compliance with building codes, for obtaining any type of building permits and licenses, and securing local installation and foundation approvals that may be required on the project, and for payment of state and local taxes which may be applicable to the sale covered by this Proposal and Contract, including tolls, ferry/funnel charges, permissions and inspections. Any amounts for any such licenses, permits, costs, charges or taxes paid by BOXX will be invoiced to Purchaser.
- d. Provide BOXX with reliable and accurate information regarding transportation, Site conditions, and access at least five (5) business days prior to the date Equipment is to be transported to Site.
- e. Reimburse BOXX for all costs incurred in order to correct improper or inaccurately constructed Site access or foundations, to correct misalignment or inaccuracy in anchor bolts, walls footings, cutouts for doors, or other work.
- f. Provide storage and be responsible for loss of or damage to materials if Site access, Site, and foundations are not ready or in accordance with the delivery provision contained in this Contract, and reimburse BOXX for all additional costs incurred by BOXX including, but not limited to, the cost of unloading, reloading, and hauting materials resulting from Purchaser's failure to perform this condition. Delay in completing foundation and inaccessibility of Site may necessitate rescheduling of the order for which BOXX shall not be responsible, and shall extend the period of performance by the period of delay. BOXX is not responsible for any loss or damage to Equipment during transportation, unless such loss or damage is noted in writing and provided to BOXX's agent or truck driver at the time of Delivery.
- g. Unless otherwise specified, pay for additional expense caused by obstructions, either overhead or underground, demolition work, grading to bring the Site to level, or extra depth, or width of the concrete footing, foundations or excavations

caused by earth fill, or abnormal soil conditions which may require foundations different from the standard plans approved by any building department, or changes to the method of Site access.

- h. The Purchaser warrants that it owns, or has the right to construct buildings on the property which the materials as described herein are to be delivered. constructed, or other work performed, and will designate to BOXX the location of the corner stakes of the property and will furnish the plat plan showing the boundary dimensions and angles of the property, and the proposed location of the Site of the building or other work to be performed together with all necessary information concerning contours, grades, soil conditions, tree locations, utility service lines, rights of way, easements, and restrictions, dimensions and other relevant data pertaining to existing structures on the premises. BOXX shall not be responsible for encroachments of any type. Purchaser warrants that said construction will not violate any zoning restrictions or other laws, and the Purchaser agrees to indemnify and hold BOXX harmless from all loss or damage which may result by reason of the construction of said building or other work done, or from any lack or defect of title in the Purchaser, or by reason of said construction violating any zoning restrictions or other laws. The soil bearing capacity shall be at least 3,000 pounds per square foot. The Purchaser is solely responsible for checking the property Site to assure that the Equipment and/or construction will not be in a "Fire District". - i. The Purchaser agrees not to interfere with the progress of the Work and not to occupy any portion of the Equipment until all terms and conditions herein are fulfilled by both parties. Purchaser further agrees that Purchaser cannot occupy the Equipment until the Work is completed or as per governing authorites' authorization where an occupancy permit, or similar type of permit, is required. Purchaser further agrees to not permit any workmen, other than those of BOXX, to work at or in the immediate vicinity of the building, without BOXX's written consent until BOXX's work on the building is completed. - b. All other remedies, unless expressly set forth herein, are hereby expressly waived by Purchaser, and Purchaser acknowledges that the exclusion of other remedies is neither unreasonable, nor unconscionable.
- c. Purchaser, for itself, and its successors, assigns and legal representatives, does hereby, now and for the future, agree to indemnify, defend, save and hold harmless the BOXX Parties, from and against any and all liability, damages, and costs of any kind, at law or in equity, arising directly or indirectly out of, or in connection with performance of the Work.
- d. In the event, Purchaser shall receive notice of any claim, suit, or action for personal injury, death, or property damage, Purchaser shall provide prompt written notification thereof to BOXX. In the event of commencement of any suit, action, or proceeding, Purchaser shall immediately assume the defense of BOXX, at Purchaser's sole cost and expense and shall wholly indemnify the BOXX Parties, as provided herein.
- e. All BOXX liability shall end upon expiration of the applicable warranty period.
- f. In no event will BOXX be liable for interruption of business, loss of profits or revenues, cost of capital, downtime costs, increased operating costs, or any special, indirect, punitive, or consequential damages.
- 9. Assignment. The Purchaser agrees that it shall not assign or transfer this Contract or any part hereof or any amount payable hereunder, except with the prior written consent of BOXX and any attempt to do so shall be null and void and of no force or effect whatsoever.
- 10. Insurance.

- a. General Liability: In conjunction with Purchaser's obligations hereunder, Purchaser must at all times have commercial general liability insurance with coverage of not less than \$2,000,000 in aggregate and \$1,000,000 per occurrence. Such insurance policy must be primary and non-contributory; and name BOXX as Certificate Holder and an additional insured.
- b. Other Insurance Requirements: Purchaser must ensure that: each insurance policy contains a waiver of subrogation in favor of BOXX, the insurer has a rating of no less than A- by the A.M. Best Rating Guide, and the insurer agrees to give BOXX at least thirty (30) days' prior written notice of cancellation of or changes to the insurance policy. Purchaser must provide BOXX with a Certificate of Insurance and endorsements prior to Delivery. Purchaser is responsible for payment of any insurance policy premiums and deductibles.

- 12. Default. In the event any act or thing required of Purchaser hereunder shall not be done and performed in the manner and at the time or times required by this Contract, Purchaser shall thereby be held in default, and all amounts due under the terms and conditions of this Contract shall be payable immediately by Purchaser to BOXX, without demand by BOXX. In addition, Purchaser will reimburse BOXX for any legal fees and costs that become due as a direct result of Purchaser's default of this Contract, and Purchaser will pay to BOXX interest at the rate of three percent (3%) per month, on the price stipulated herein. Interest will be calculated from the date said default takes place, through and including the date of full and final payment.
- 13. No Waiver. The failure by BOXX to enforce at any time, or for any period of time, any of the terms of this Proposal and Contract shall not be a waiver of such terms and conditions or of BOXX's right thereafter to enforce each and every term and condition contained herein.
- 14. Entire Contract. Upon acceptance, this proposal, together with its terms and condition, shall constitute the entire contract between BOXX and Purchaser, there being merged all prior and collateral representations, promises and conditions in connection with this proposal; and any representations, promise or condition not incorporated herein shall not be binding on either party.
- 15. Title. Title to the Equipment will be conveyed to the Purchaser simultaneously with payment in full of the total price plus all applicable taxes.
- 16. Governing Law. This Contract shall be construed in accordance with and be governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. All disputes arising in connection with this Contract, including any question regarding its existence or validity, shall be resolved by a state or Federal Court of BOXX's choosing.
- 17. Definitions.
- a. "Change Order" means a written order signed by BOXX and Purchaser after execution of this Contract, indicating changes in the scope of the Work or schedule, including substitutions proposed by BOXX and accepted by Purchaser.
- b. "Delivery" means the date that Equipment arrives at the Site.
- c. "Site" means the geographical area of the project location.
- d. "Work" means the Equipment and Services provided by BOXX in connection with this Contract.
- 18. General. Clerical errors contained herein are subject to correction.

19. Warranty: BOXX provides only the following "Warranty":



School District and School HIB Grades Required by the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act

The official school and district harassment, intimidation, and bullying (HIB) grade reports, as required under the *Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act (P.L.* 2020, c. 122), are now available for public release.

Key steps/actions

- School districts must access their official HIB Grade Reports dated April 26, 2023, through the HIB Grades
 application on the New Jersey Department of Education's (NJDOE) <u>Homeroom webpage</u>. Directions for
 accessing the reports can be found in the Guidance document on the <u>Commissioner's Program for</u>
 Determining Grades' website.
- 2. Districts and schools are required to post the official reports on their websites by May 10, 2023.
- 3. District officials must review the district and school grades at a public board of education meeting.

The Commissioner's Program for Determining Grades under the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act should be part of an integrated process to strengthen school climate and culture through prevention and intervention that addresses harassment, intimidation, and bullying. District and school staff are encouraged to use the data to educate staff and the community about current school practices and engage them in identifying and addressing areas for improvement.

Additional resources for districts and schools to utilize regarding school climate can be found in the School Climate
Strategy Resource Guide. This strategy resource guide was created as a companion to the New Jersey School Climate Improvement Survey (NJ SCI) which is a valid and reliable, no-cost school climate survey that is available to all public schools in New Jersey. For more information on how the NJ SCI survey can help your school district assess their school climate in an effort to make data-driven decisions on program implementation, visit the NJ SCI Survey Platform.

COUNTY EDUCATIONAL SI	ERVICES COMMISSION	(hereinafter the "Commission"	"), located at 45 Cardinal
Drive, Westfield, NJ 07090			·

WITNESSETH:

In the consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. <u>Education Program.</u> The Board agrees to purchase the auxiliary and handicapped services pursuant to P.L. 1977, Chapters 192-193 from the Commission.

The Commission agrees to provide the auxiliary and handicapped services to those eligible students identified in accordance with the applicable New Jersey Statutes and the rules and regulations of the State Board of Education and the policies of the Board of Directors of the Commission.

The auxiliary and handicapped services to be provided are limited to P.L. 192 Compensatory Education, English-As-A-Second Language, Transportation and Maintenance, Home Instruction. P.L.193 Supplementary Instruction, Speech Correction and Examination and Classification for eligible pupils.

The Commission will provide the following:

- a) Pupil Identification Process
- b) Child Study and Speech Pupil Evaluation
- c) Development of required service plans (Speech-Language, Supplementary Instruction, ISIP)
- d) Instructional Equipment, Facilities and Specialized Instruction Supplies and Materials.
- e) Staff Development, Observation and Evaluation(s) per law.
- f) Supervision and Administration required for the implementation of services and programs.

The Commission shall complete all State required reports including the nonpublic auxiliary and handicapped report and provide data for project completion reports for the review of the Board.

The Board shall require that schools forward all State mandated reports, forms and pupil applications directly to the Commission offices.

- 2. <u>Term</u>. This Service Agreement shall be in effect from the date of adoption by the Board until June 30, 2024, unless terminated sooner as provided herein.
- 3. Payment of State Aid. The Board, as consideration for the education program, shall transmit State Aid payments to the Commission based on monthly billing statements for services to eligible students.

The Board agrees to pay monthly based on the funding sheets of the State Department of Education and actual services rendered. Billing shall commence in September and shall continue for nine (9) successive months. The Commission shall adjust the monthly billing statements to reflect approved additional funding and actual state aid for that month. The Commission shall at no time bill more than the approved State Aid.

The annual billing charge for each eligible pupil provided services in compensatory education, speech, English as a Second Language, shall be based on approved State Aid figures and listed on Schedule A of

this Agreement when provided by the Department of Education.

Eligible student and service verification shall be provided to the Board by computer printout included as part of the monthly billing and project completions report information. 407-1's will be sent with the project completion report at the end of the year.

The Commission shall refund State Aid received from districts in excess of that permitted to be expended based on service request received to districts by June 30th of each year.

The Commission shall provide quality and effective instructional programs and services, interfacing with nonpublic school personnel, parents and guardians, and the local school district to insure effective articulation.

4. <u>School Year</u>. The Commission, in its sole discretion, shall fix the school calendar for the school year, and it is understood by the Board that the Commission's school year and school calendar may not coincide with the school year of calendar of the Board. A copy of the Commission's school calendar shall be furnished to the Board by the Commission on or before September 1st of the school year. The Commission reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or otherwise alter the scheduling of any classes due to inclement weather or other reasons.

Student instructional services shall be scheduled for:

- a) A minimum of thirty (30) minutes per week of compensatory education.
- b) A minimum of thirty (30) minutes per week of E.S.L. instruction.
- c) A minimum of thirty (30) minutes per week of speech instruction.
- d) A minimum of thirty (30) minutes per week of supplementary instruction.

5. <u>District Authorizations</u>

The Board authorizes parents or nonpublic schools to submit student applications directly to the Commission.

The Board authorizes the Commission to verify eligibility and complete the disposition section of the student application

The Board authorizes the Commission Superintendent to sign the disposition section of the student application.

The Board authorizes the Commission to maintain electronic files and to make those files available to district personnel as needed via a secure password.

The Board authorizes the Commission to list the Director of Nonpublic School Services as the contact person on services plan instead of the District's Director of Special Services.

The Board authorizes the nonpublic schools to hold student assessment results and/or other educational documentation (standardized test results, portfolio, etc) and will make this information available to districts, the Commission, or NJDOE when requested.

- 6. <u>Staff.</u> The Commission shall employ all staff required to provide the educational programs and services identified in this agreement. The Commission shall ensure that all staff have the appropriate certifications and are employed in accordance with all rules and regulations of the New Jersey Department of Education.
- 7. <u>Facilities</u>. The Commission shall provide instructional trailers or mobile classrooms as needed. Whenever possible, instruction will take place in the nonpublic school.

- 8. Records. The Commission shall maintain all student records and shall provide the names of students and new student applications to the Board with the monthly billing statements. The Commission shall also make said records available to the Board in electronic media whenever possible.
- 9. <u>Administration</u>. The Commission shall provide all administrative staff required to manage and evaluate the staff and services provided. The Commission shall ensure that all administrative staff are properly certified and employed in accordance with all rules and regulations of the New Jersey Department of Education.
- 10. <u>Application Documents and Procedure</u>. Enrollment in the education programs is based upon State eligibility requirements.

11. <u>Insurance</u>.

- A. The Commission, at its sole cost and expense, shall provide and maintain at all times during the term of this Agreement, general public liability insurance and property damage insurance, naming the Board as an additional insured against claims arising out of the education program, and shall keep on deposit a certificate or other evidence that such insurance is in full force and effect and that all premiums have been paid. Such insurance shall be maintained with insurance companies qualified to do business in the State of New Jersey, and shall provide coverage of at least \$100,000.00 for property damage \$300,000.00 for the injury or death of one person, and \$1,000,000.00 for injuries and death arising from one accident. The above policies for public liability and property damage insurance shall include contingent liability and contingent damage insurance protecting the Commission and the Board against claims arising from the operations of all independent contractors.
- B. The party to this Agreement which shall be responsible for the furnishing of pupil transportation shall require each vendor providing transportation to provide and maintain, at the vendor's sole cost and expense, at all times during the term of this Agreement, automobile and public liability insurance, naming the Commission and the Board as additional insured against claims arising out of the use of all automobiles or other motor vehicles for the transportation of pupils for the special education classes, and the party to this Agreement responsible for the furnishing of such transportation shall keep on deposit with the other party a certificate of insurance or other evidence that such insurance is in full force and effect and that all premiums have been paid therefore. Such insurance shall be maintained with insurance companies qualified to do business in the State of New Jersey and shall provide coverage of at least \$100,000.00 for property damage, \$300,000.00 for the injury or death of one person, and \$1,000,000.00 for injuries and death arising from one accident.
- 12. Independent Contractor. The Board is not an agent of the Commission. The Board shall have no authority to bind the Commission by any representation, warranty or agreement, unless specifically authorized in writing by the Commission. The Commission is an independent contractor under this agreement, and no employee, officer or director of the Board shall have the authority to bind the Commission by any representation, warranty or agreement unless specifically authorized in writing by the Commission and Board employees shall not be deemed or treated as employees or agents of the Commission.
- 13. Indemnification. The Board shall defend, indemnify, protect and save and keep harmless the Commission, its successors and assigns, from and against all losses, damages, injuries, claims, demands and expenses, including legal expenses, caused by or arising out of the education program, the classification or placement of each pupil, including but not limited to claims by the New Jersey State Department of Education, pupils enrolled in the special education classes, or the parents of such pupils.
- 14. <u>Default</u>. The failure of the Board to cure or remedy a default, within ten (10) days after written notice of the default has been given, shall be deemed an uncured default. This Agreement may, at the option of the Commission, be terminated upon the occurrence of any uncured default or in the event the Board becomes insolvent or bankrupt, makes as assignment the benefit of creditors, a trustee or receiver is appointed for the Board, or if bankruptcy, reorganization, arrangement, insolvency or liquidation proceedings are instituted by or against the Board.

- 15. <u>Compliance with Governmental Laws</u>. Each party hereto, in the performance of this Agreement, shall comply with all applicable governmental laws, rules and regulations.
- 16. <u>Execution of Documents</u>. The parties agree to execute this and any other documents that may be necessary to affect the intent and purpose of this Agreement.
- 17. <u>New Jersey Law</u>. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of New Jersey and shall be construed in accordance therewith.

This contract is further subject to the rules and regulations of the State of New Jersey as to programming and services provided. The Commission shall not be liable for delays or termination of services by reason of actions by the State of New Jersey or the State Department of Education, which results from the withdrawal of funding, facility state approval, or lack thereof.

- 18. <u>No Waiver</u>. No provision hereof may be waived except by an agreement in writing signed by the waiving party. The waiver of any term or provision shall not be construed or deemed to be an estoppel or waiver in the future of any such term or provision, but the same shall continue in full force and effect.
- 19. Benefit. This agreement shall bind the parties hereto, their successors and assigns.
- 20. Notices. Any notice required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be sufficient if in writing, and if served personally or sent by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, to a party at the addressed set forth below. Notice by mail shall be deemed given when deposited at a United State Post Office with postage prepaid thereon, addressed as follows:

- 21. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This document represents the entire Agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations or agreements, either written or oral.
- 22. <u>Amendments</u>. No amendments or additions to this Agreement shall be binding unless in writing and signed by the parties hereto.
- 23. <u>Severability</u>. The provisions of the Agreement shall be deemed to be severable. If any provision herein is adjudged to be invalid or unenforceable, by a court of competent jurisdiction or by operation of any applicable law, such provision shall be deemed amended to conform to law, and it shall not affect the validity of any other provision herein, but such other provision shall remain in full force and effect.

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the chief school administrator of the public school district or designee (UCESC) to confer with the administrator of each participating nonpublic school within the district to advise the nonpublic school of the limit of funds available and to agree upon the technology to be provided to the nonpublic school within the limits of the funds that are available for the nonpublic school, and

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the public school district to send written verification that conferences were held with each nonpublic school administrator to the County Superintendent, along with a copy of each agreement, and

WHEREAS, it shall be the responsibility of each public school district to provide the agreed upon technology which may include equipment, software, professional development and/or maintenance of equipment, and

WHEREAS, the Union County Educational Services Commission has agreed to administer the responsibilities associated with this program for the purpose of greater cost effectiveness through joint purchasing and centralized administration,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Hillside Board of Education enter into an agreement with the Union County Educational Services Commission, whereby the Commission will administer the Nonpublic School Technology Initiative Program for nonpublic schools located within its boundaries for the 2023-2024 school year; and

U.C.E.S.C. will bill the Public School District for services rendered to the nonpublic school including a 5% administrative fee. In the event a Public School District fails to remit funds to the U.C.E.S.C. within the schedule set forth, the U.C.E.S.C. shall have the right to give notice of discontinued services.



 - E. Enter into an agreement with the nonpublic school(s) that they will store the equipment at the end of the school year at no cost to the public school district. When the equipment is no longer required, it will be returned to the public school district. Only the public school district may dispose of such equipment in accordance with the "Public School Contracts Law";
- III. The Public School District agrees to forward one copy of the minutes of the board meeting, where the Nonpublic School Technology Initiative Program Plan (attached Appendix A) is approved, with a copy of the Plan sent to the County Superintendent of Schools and the Union County Educational Services Commission immediately following its board meeting.



WITNESSETH:

In the consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Education Program</u>. The Board agrees to purchase from the Commission, and the Commission agrees to provide the Board, with the following services for eligible students attending private schools, excluding preschool age students, identified in accordance with the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) and the applicable rules and regulations of the New Jersey Board of Education:
 - a) Participation in consultation meetings with the private (nonpublic) schools initiated by the District;
 - b) Appropriate related services determined by the District (e.g., OT, PT, Counseling, Speech/Language Therapy, and/or Supplemental Services); and
 - c) Additional IDEA services as specified by the District's Director of Special Services in consultation with the nonpublic school administrator.

The specific services to be provided shall be determined by the District after consultation with its nonpublic schools and shall be listed by the District in Schedule A to this agreement. The District shall include in Schedule A the amount of the proportionate share of funds for each nonpublic school, excluding the grant amount for preschool students.

The Commission may also provide the following additional services:

- a) Data necessary for the Board's completion of mandated IDEA-B reports;
- b) Specialized Instruction Supplies & Materials:
- c) Staff Development, Observation and Evaluation(s) per law; and
- d) Supervision and Administration required for the implementation of services and programs.

The Commission shall provide quality and effective instructional programs and services, interfacing with nonpublic school personnel, parents and guardians, and the District to insure effective articulation. All services and materials provided by the Commission shall be secular, neutral and nonideological.

- 2. <u>Term.</u> This Agreement shall be in effect from July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024, it being understood that actual student services will not be provided during the summer recess.
- 3. Payment of Federal Part B Funds. The Board, agrees to pay the Commission for services provided in accordance with the rates specified in Schedule A. Billing shall commence in October and shall continue thereafter, at the Commission's option, on a monthly basis, with each payment being due within 15 days of receipt by the District, until the funds are depleted. Billing shall include description of the services provided.
- 4. <u>School Year.</u> The Commission, in its sole discretion, shall fix the school calendar for the school year, and it is understood by the Board that the Commission's school year and school calendar may not coincide with the school year of calendar of the Board. The Commission reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or otherwise alter the scheduling of any services or classes due to inclement weather or other reasons beyond its control.

5. <u>District Obligations</u>

The Board shall advise the Commission of the identity of each nonpublic school within the district and shall require each nonpublic school to provide the Commission with completed pupil applications and to provide the Commission with access to pupil records on file in the school as requested by the Commission.

- 6. <u>Staff.</u> The Commission shall employ all staff required to provide the educational programs and services identified in this agreement. The Commission shall ensure that all staff have the appropriate certifications and are employed in accordance with all rules and regulations of the New Jersey Department of Education.
- 7. Facilities. Services shall be provided on-site at the student's private school.
- 8. Records. The Commission shall maintain all IDEA-B student records while services are being provided and shall provide the names of students served to the Board with the billing statements.
- 9. <u>Administration</u>. The Commission shall provide all administrative staff required to manage and evaluate the staff and services provided. The Commission shall ensure that all administrative staff are properly certified and employed in accordance with all rules and regulations of the New Jersey Department of Education.
- **10.** Application Documents and Procedure. Enrollment in the education programs is based upon Federal eligibility requirements.
- 11. <u>Independent Contractor</u>. The Board is not an agent of the Commission. The Board shall have no authority to bind the Commission by any representation, warranty or agreement, unless specifically authorized in writing by the Commission. The Commission is an independent contractor under this Agreement. Board employees shall not be deemed or treated as employees or agents of the Commission.
- 12. <u>Indemnification</u>. The Commission shall indemnify the Board, its successors and assigns, from and against all losses, damages, injuries, claims, and demands, arising out of this Agreement, to the extent such losses, damages, injuries, claims and demands are caused by the negligence of the Commission. This indemnification provision shall not extend to claims made by the U.S. Department of Education or the NJDOE regarding the delivery of services under this Agreement.
- 13. <u>Default</u>. The failure of the Board to cure or remedy a default, within ten (10) days after written notice of the default has been given, shall be deemed an uncured default. This Agreement may, at the option of the Commission, be terminated upon the occurrence of any uncured default or in the event the Board becomes insolvent or bankrupt, makes as assignment the benefit of creditors, a trustee or receiver is appointed for the Board, or if bankruptcy, reorganization, arrangement, insolvency or liquidation proceedings are instituted by or against the Board.
- 14. <u>Termination</u>. Either party may terminate this Agreement on 90 days written notice to the other party.
- 15. <u>Compliance with Governmental Laws</u>. Each party hereto, in the performance of this Agreement, shall comply with all applicable governmental laws, rules, and regulations.
- 16. <u>Execution of Documents</u>. The parties agree to execute this and any other documents that may be necessary to affect the intent and purpose of this Agreement.
- 17. <u>New Jersey Law</u>. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of New Jersey and shall be construed in accordance therewith.

- 20. Notices. Any notice required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be sufficient if in writing,

Notice by mail shall be deemed given when deposited at a United States Post Office with postage prepaid thereon, addressed to the Superintendent of Schools of the respective party at the address set forth at the outset of this Agreement.

- 21. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This document represents the entire Agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations or agreements, either written or oral.
- 22. <u>Amendments</u>. No amendments or additions to this Agreement shall be binding unless in writing and signed by the parties hereto.
- 23. Severability. The provisions of the Agreement shall be deemed to be severable. If any provision herein is adjudged to be invalid or unenforceable, by a court of competent jurisdiction or by operation of any applicable law, such provision shall be deemed amended to conform to law, and it shall not effect the validity of any other provision herein, but such other provision shall remain in full force and effect.



WHEREAS, the Board is obliged to provide the services to all eligible nonpublic schools within its district to assure equal access to specified nursing services; and

WHEREAS, the District, by resolution of its Board, has agreed to contract with the Commission to provide said services pursuant to P.L. 1991, Ch. 226;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- I. The terms and conditions of this Agreement shall be in effect from July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024, it being understood that actual student services will not be provided during the summer recess.
- II. A. The Commission agrees to provide the Board with the following services, within the limitation of funds allocated by the NJDOE, for pupils enrolled full-time in the nonpublic school:
 - 1. assisting with medical examinations, including dental screening;
 - conducting audiometric screening;
 - 3. maintenance of student health records and notification of local or county health officials of any student who has not been properly immunized;
 - 4. conducting scoliosis examinations of pupils between the ages of 10 and 18; and
 - 5. extending emergency care for students who become injured or ill at school or during participation on a school team or squad when a Commission-provided nurse is on duty at the location.
 - B. To the extent additional funds remain available after the provision of the abovereferenced services, and within the limit of remaining funds available, the nonpublic school students will be provided with additional medical services as agreed upon by the District, the nonpublic school, and the Commission, which may include the purchase of equipment,


comparable to that in use in the District, for the purpose of providing services under this Agreement.

- C. The Commission may charge against available funds the cost of supplies purchased for the purpose of providing health services under this Agreement, which supplies shall be comparable to that used in the District.

The Board shall transmit payments to the Commission based on monthly billing statements for services to students of eligible nonpublic schools, with each payment being due no later than the 15th of the month following receipt of the Commission's billing statement. The Commission may include in its billing statement for each full-time nonpublic student served the lesser of the actual administrative costs or 6% of the funds allocated for each participating nonpublic school in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:16-2.5(h)(3).

Proposal for Hillside School District Sheltered English Instruction Training Summer Intensive 2023

Initiative Overview

The Hillside School District is dedicated to cultivating an inclusive culture and climate that equips all students with a love for learning that will position them for success. Through the implementation of Sheltered English Instruction (SEI) strategies, teachers can craft a culture that is both accommodating and challenging for students. The SEI philosophy is one that promotes comprehensible input while also targeting cognitive, metacognitive, and social learning strategies. Students emerge from SEI-infused classrooms with a more complete understanding of who they are as learners, what strengths and learning strategies they possess, and an understanding of what challenges them.

With a background ranging from teaching to administration, Up the Bar Educational Achievement truly understands the tremendous challenges that districts face as they strive to create inclusive environments. Our professional learning methods go beyond simply imparting knowledge to teachers. Up the Bar prides itself on being Implementation Experts, not only educating teachers on the 'what' and 'why' of adopting best practices, but also guiding them through the 'how' to achieve results. It is this critical stage of follow through that defines Up the Bar as the transformative, meaningful option for authentic and sincere professional development.

To that end, it is recommended that Up the Bar Educational Achievement expand its partnership with the Hillside School District. The goal of this partnership is to efficiently affect a cultural shift throughout each of the schools, articulating consistency and a common language that is critical to achieve the district vision of excellence and equity. The means to meeting this goal will be to provide district faculty the comprehensive training, guidance, and support that is required to Up the Bar on the level of leadership and knowledge they impart within their respective school communities.



Sheltered English Instruction Professional Learning Series

Designed to establish a learning community through sustained and consistent engagement throughout the year, building trust and laying the groundwork in areas that are critical to the success of ALL students. Three full-day intensive classes for cohorts, tailored to thoroughly investigate how to strategically and thoughtfully plan for instruction so that all students have equitable access to content while developing all of their linguistic and cross-cultural skills. Emphasis is placed on implementation as teachers will be encouraged and expected to reflect on their current practices and then strategically plan SEI-infused lessons and units for the upcoming school year.

Day One

1a. How Well Do You KYS (Know Your Students)?

Effectively and strategically integrating a diversity of learners into the school community requires an understanding of and an appreciation for students' backgrounds. During this intensive and highly interactive class, you will learn how to KYS – Know Your Students. You will learn how to build strong relationships with your students, which will in turn allow for more precise differentiation of instruction, which will in turn lead to greater learning and academic success for ALL of your students.

KYS topics to be explored:

- Factors affecting second language acquisition
- English language learner typologies
- Stages of second language acquisition
- Stages of Culture Shock
- The Cultural Iceberg

1b. Comprehensible Input

English language learners (ELLs) compel teachers to consider how their students can succeed in the delicate balancing act of acquiring both content and language. Engaging in the process of sheltered English instructional scaffolds, teachers learn to thoughtfully plan their lessons complete with visuals, meaningful tasks, and effective learning strategies in a culturally responsive and collaborative environment. Teachers of ELLs become stronger, more creative, and more competent as they rise to the challenge of creating equitable access to education for all of their students. As they experience the sheltered English instructional scaffolds, participants will emerge with a renewed appreciation for the richness that results from cultural diversity.



Day Two

2a. Building Background

Students come to school with a rich and wide array of background experiences and knowledge. The teacher considers how to leverage those experiences to increase everyone's learning potential. Additionally, critical background information must be provided in order for student to more successfully engage in and learn new material. A plethora of strategies that may be used for this purpose will be explored during this class. An emphasis will be placed on the authentic and multimodal approach to how students learn academic language for the purpose of academic discourse.

2b. Collaborate Like A Champ

When students are provided with the opportunity to process and engage in critical thinking and problem solving with their peers, they are afforded the opportunity to process their thoughts in their own native language and then take the time to consider how to most effectively articulate those ideas in English. This kind of oral rehearsal serves all students, but it is especially important for English language learners. Collaborative learning fosters a culture and climate wherein a community of learners engage together and learn together. The five essential elements of collaborative learning to be explored:

- · Positive interdependence
- · Face-to-face interaction
- Individual accountability
- Social skills
- · Team processing

Day Three

3a. Creating & Implementing Authentic Academic Language Objectives

Authentic access to academic language is critical to the success of English language learners. Moving beyond tips, make-and-take strategies, and vocabulary games, educators who learn how to create meaningful academic language objectives at the word, sentence, and discourse levels create optimal learning environments wherein all of their students will access content concepts, and the language associated with that content. During this class, participants will understand the value of academic language objectives and they will engage in the how-to for creating academic language objectives, including the value of differentiated scaffolding supports.



3b Authentic and Equitable Assessment

Students who are acquiring content while developing the English language are accountable for learning the content concepts, but must be provided the language support they need to articulate what they have learned. That is, the curriculum should not be watered down for them, given that they are cognitively capable of learning the concepts, but linguistically may not have the English language to express themselves. Therefore, teachers need to consider options for assessing students' knowledge and skills using the English language they know. A variety of assessment options and opportunities will be explored during this class, including how all students can take ownership of their learning process by tracking their own data and learning.

Administrator Access


Administrators will learn the 'Look Fors' when observing students who are actively engaged in their learning due to the conscientious implementation of research-based strategies by their inspired teachers. Administrators will adjust their collective lens as they gain clearer insight into how a classroom infused with sheltered English instructional strategies will operate, so that they may provide support and validation to teachers as they Up the Bar.


