## **Admission Terms**

- **<u>Early Decision (Binding)</u>**: a student who is accepted as an **ED** applicant must attend the college
- **<u>Early Action (Non Binding)</u>**: students receive an **early** response to their application but do not have to commit to the college until the normal reply date of May 1 <u>Restrictive Early Action</u>: you may not apply to any other schools in the **early** rounds •
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- Regular Decision: the normal process by which students apply by published deadlines, with promise of receiving an admissions decision no later that April 1 of their senior year
   Rolling Admission: candidates are invited to submit their applications to the university anytime within a large window
   Waitlisted: the college has finished reviewing your file and made a decision to put you on a waiting list for admission
   Deferred: an institution has not yet completed reviewing an application file and will make a final decision on admission status at a later date •
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## What Colleges Are Looking For:

#### What Colleges are Looking For in a Succesful Applicant

- High School GPA and Class Rank.
- AP and Honors Classes. Being able to show prospective colleges that you challenged yourself academically is important. ...
- Challenging Extracurricular Activities. ...
- Volunteer and Work Experience. ...
- Test Scores. ...
- Quality Recommendation Letters. ...
- A Well-Written Essay. ...
- Talents and Passions.



## **3 Types of Schools to Apply to:**

1.<u>Reach Schools:</u> colleges you have to "reach" for --- means that they have academic profiles whose average scores are higher than yours. (Don't sell yourself short—Apply anyway!-it is good to push yourself and see what your options are.)

2. <u>**Target Schools:**</u> your realistic schools---colleges whose academic profiles match your personal academic profile

3.<u>Safety Schools:</u> back up options---academic profiles whose averages are lower than yours and have higher acceptance rates (schools you know you will get in)

## **Graduation Testing Requirements**

All Junior will have to demonstrate proficiency on the New Jersey Graduation Performance Assessment(NJGPA) in LA and Math to Graduate in June 2023.

**Secondary Pathways** 

SAT LA( 450) Math (440)

>ACT (16)

>ASVAB (31)

>ACCUPLACER LA (6) Math (76)

Students who do not demonstrate proficiency on NJGPA will have a 0 and or 9th period class added to their Senior year schedule.

## <mark>SAT vs. ACT</mark>

- SATs- Scholastic Aptitude Test
  - Reading, Math, & Writing- Essay (optional)
  - Strong Math Skills
- ACT- formerly known as, "American College Testing"
  - English, Math, Reading, Science, & Writing (optional)
  - Strong English Skills
- <u>SAT vs ACT</u>: It is recommended to take both Junior year, then retake the one you prefer, Senior year
  - Register Junior Year: Spring
  - Register Senior Year: Fall
- Free/Reduced Lunch- Ask about a "Fee Waiver"



#### **<u>Register for the SATs and/or ACTs</u>**

Some schools are TEST OPTIONAL, but you can still take the SAT or ACT if you choose to do so.
